- This internship is educational in nature and there is no guarantee or expectation that the internship will result in employment.
- Company may at any time in its sole discretion, terminate the internship without notice or cause.
- Intern will maintain a regular internship schedule determined by the Intern and their supervisor.
- Intern will demonstrate honesty, punctuality, courtesy, cooperative attitude, proper health and grooming habits, appropriate dress and a willingness to learn.
- Intern will obey the policies, rules and regulations of the Company site and comply with the Company's business practices and procedures.
- Intern will furnish his/her supervisor with all necessary information pertaining to my unpaid internship, including related assignments and reports.
- Under no circumstances will Intern leave the internship without first conferring with Intern's supervisor.
- Transportation to and from the internship site is the responsibility of the Intern.

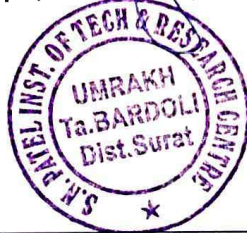

### AND

SITARAMBHAI NARANJI PATEL INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY & RESEARCH CENTRE, UMRK having its premises at Vidyabharti Campus, At & Po Baben, Ta: Bardoli, Dist: Surat, Gujarat, India, Pin: 394601 and having 220 number of computer systems (hereinafter referred to as "Exam Centre" which expression shall, where so ever the context so requires or admits, mean and include the executors, administrators, successors, attorneys, representatives and permitted assigns) of the Second Part.

(Bizzlon and the SITARAMBHAI NARANJI PATEL INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY & RESEARCH CENTRE, UMRK are collectively referred to herein as the "Parties" and individually as "Party")

### WHEREAS

- A. Bizzlon is a company engaged in the business of providing Testing & Assessment infrastructure for various organizations in India and abroad.

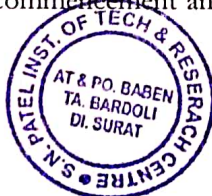
NOW THEREFORE THIS MOU WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS

1. PURPOSE

- 1.1 The **Exam Centre** hereby agrees that they shall provide the said Premises and infrastructure to **client of Bizzlon** to enable them to conduct the computer based examination activities on behalf of their clients.

2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES

- 2.1 The **Exam Centre** agrees to provide the said Premises for a period mutually agreed upon or for the complete duration of any such examinations/Tests.

- 2.3 It is further agreed that the any Premises so made available for a particular project shall at all times be exclusively available to **Bizzlon's client** for the period of this MOU.
- 2.4 The said Premises shall be handed over to **Bizzlon and Bizzlon's client** along with the infrastructure agreed upon by and between the Parties and more clearly set out in **Schedule 'A'**
- 2.5 The **Exam Centre** shall provide with the said Premises 3 to 5 days prior to the commencement date of any examination as agreed between the Parties.
- 2.6 The **Exam Centre** shall provide with 10% additional Exam PCs to the number that the booking is made as a contingency for any outage.
- 2.7 **Bizzlon's client** shall have complete control over the activities of the Premises for the duration of the examination including the provision and maintenance of staff.
- 2.8 The **Exam Centre** needs to ensure that any scheduled maintenance activities within the premises are not held during conduct of any such examinations/Tests.
- 2.9 The **Exam Centre** shall provide IT infrastructure as per specifications / guidelines provided by Bizzlon.
- 2.10 The **Exam Centre** shall provide IT resources, Invigilators and support staff as per requirement of **Bizzlon**. **Exam Centre** shall ensure that their resources are not involved in any malpractice during the conduct of exam.
- 2.11 **Exam Centre** will take complete responsibility of any malpractice that occurs at the exam Centre during the conduct of exam.
- 2.12 The **Exam Centre** should submit a written undertaking that except licensed OS and drivers no other software like remote access tool/ malware / spyware etc. are installed in the computer nodes.
- 2.13 All machines, IT peripherals, DG, UPS, ACs, Data Rack hygiene should be thoroughly tested by **Exam Centre** before exam commencement and a declaration should be submitted to **Bizzlon** with supporting document

- 2.14 **Bizzlon's client** shall place a signboard in the name of the Examination Centre with **their** signage at the said Premises which shall be placed / located in such a manner that it would be easily accessible for the students visiting the said Premises to appear for the examination. The Premises shall be wholly and completely run as an Examination Centre during the time period as mentioned herein.

### 3. CONSIDERATION

- 3.1 **Bizzlon** shall pay the **Exam Centre** at the rate mutually agreed upon from project to project basis thru their authorized partner.

### 4. CONDITIONS SUBSEQUENT TO THIS UNDERSTANDING

- 4.1 The **Exam Centre** shall ensure that there will be no disturbance or any sort of interruptions in the form of noise or in any other manner during such period and at the time when the Computer Based Examination/Test is in process.
- 4.2 The **Exam Centre** shall ensure that all the authorized candidates having the hall tickets issued for the concerned Examination/Test shall be allowed to enter the premises of the **CENTRE** without any hindrance/ interruptions from the **CENTRE**.
- 4.3 The **Exam Centre** shall at no point of time make any announcements with respect to dates of Examination without the prior consent from **Bizzlon**.
- 4.4 It is further agreed between the Parties that the running of the Centre and all the activities relating to the Computer Based Examination/Test shall be conducted by the staff provided by **Bizzlon's client**.
- 4.5 **Exam Centre** shall maintain its staff at the Premises for the period of the Examination Scheduled.
- 4.6 Furthermore, it is agreed between the Parties that the **Exam Centre** shall be obliged to abide by the terms (commercial or institutional) laid down by **Bizzlon** and **Bizzlon's client** during such period as mentioned herein.
- 4.7 **Exam Centre** will ensure that they uninstall the software, server, firewall application at the end of the period mentioned herein and shall maintain the Centre in the same condition as it was at the time when **Bizzlon** had hired the Premises and subject to normal wear and tear.
- 4.8 The term 'end of the period' mentioned hereinabove shall mean that the contractual obligations between **Bizzlon** and the **Exam Centre** shall be completed for the time frame provided in Clause 2.1.

- 4.11 The **Exam Centre** should strictly ensure that no mobile phone is being used by exam Centre staff during the complete duration of exam unless authorized by Bizzlon in writing.

## 5. NONCOMPETITION & NON SOLICITATION

- 5.1 The **Exam Centre** undertakes that it shall not without the **Bizzlon's** prior written consent, either during or within two years after completion of this Agreement or termination of this Agreement whichever is the later, engage employ or otherwise solicit for employment any person who, during the relevant period, was appointed and/or employed by **Bizzlon**.

## 6. TERM & TERMINATION

- 6.1 This MOU shall be in force for a period of Five (5) years from the date of execution and shall terminate on the expiry of such period. In the event that the Parties seek to continue their association, a fresh MOU may be executed by the Parties, on the expiry of the said term of this MOU.

- 9.1 **Exam Centre** shall defend, indemnify, and save harmless Bizzlon and its officers and directors, employees, agents, and representatives from and against any losses, damages, costs, attorneys' fees, penalties, fees, liabilities, Misconduct or indiscipline of any employee/employees or student/or any person/persons indulging in criminal activity/activities, or expenses (collectively, "Losses") associated with any third party claim against Bizzlon connected with (i) death, or (ii) injury to persons, or (iii) breach of confidentiality, in each case resulting from the acts or omissions of the Exam Centre, its employees, agents or contractors.
- 9.2 **Exam Centre** agrees to defend, indemnify and hold Bizzlon, harmless against all suits, claims and proceedings made by a third party to the extent such suit, claim or proceeding alleges any infringement by Exam Centre of any intellectual property rights in respect of the usage of Equipment and/or Software, and fully cooperate with Bizzlon in such settlement or defense

9.3 The provisions of this clause shall survive the termination of this MOU.

## 10. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Notwithstanding anything contained herein, Bizzlon in any event, regardless of the form of claim, shall be liable for (i) any direct, indirect, punitive, exemplary, speculative, consequential or incidental losses, damages, claims, liabilities, charges, costs, expenses (including, without limitation, loss of use, data, revenue, profits, business and for any claims of any third party claiming through Bizzlon) that may arise out of or result from this Agreement, irrespective of whether it had an advance notice of the possibility of any such damages; or (ii) damages relating to any claim that accrued more than One (1) year before the institution of adversarial proceedings thereon.

## 11. ARBITRATION

In the event of any dispute, difference, claim or question arising out of the MOU during the continuance of the same or upon or after termination thereof, such dispute or difference shall be referred to arbitration in accordance with the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The venue of the arbitral proceedings shall be Mumbai and shall be conducted in English.

## 12. ANTI-CORRUPTION

Each party agrees that it shall comply fully with all applicable anti-corruption and anti-bribery laws, including but not limited to the India's Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988. Any breach or violation of any provision contained in this Subsection by either party will be grounds for immediate termination of this Agreement by the other party.

## 13. PUBLICITY

Exam Centre shall not use the Bizzlon's name or logo or disclose the business relationship created under this MOU in any external communication or marketing materials.

## 14. GENERAL

### 14.1 Waiver

No failure to exercise and no delay in exercising on the part of any of the Parties hereto any right, power or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, power or privilege preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the

exercise of any other right, power or privilege. The rights and remedies provided in this MOU are cumulative and not exclusive of any rights or, remedies otherwise provided by law.

Neither Party may assign its rights or obligations in whole or part hereunder to any affiliate or third Party without the prior written consent of the other.

#### 14.3 Severability

Notwithstanding that any provision of this MOU may prove to be illegal or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this MOU shall continue in full force and effect.

#### 14.4 Entire MOU

This MOU and all **Schedules**, if any, attached hereto, constitute the entire MOU between the Parties hereto with respect to the matters dealt with herein and therein.

#### 14.5 Notices

All notices, requests, consents and other communications under this Agreement must be in writing and must be:

### Scope of Agreement

1. NSEIT Online examinations shall be conducted at the Service Provider Centre as per the terms and conditions of this Agreement on a mutually agreed date and time of the month.
2. Service Provider to confirm NSEIT of Test Infrastructure Facilities/ Date availability within 48 hours of receiving inquiry.
3. Service Provider to revert to NSEIT with signed and sealed copy of the Purchase Order acceptance within 48 hrs. of receipt of PO, failing which it will be deemed to be accepted.
4. Service Provider will allot and make available the test rooms / labs to NSEIT for exclusive use to NSEIT on the scheduled exam dates as well during mock run day(s). Once PO is raised, venue cannot cancel the booking due to subsequent intimation sent to candidates for exam venue
5. Prior to signing the agreement or confirming venue for any exam requirement, Test venue infrastructure provided (PCs, Network Switches, Rack, Firewall, Modems, Internet bandwidth & speed, LAN, OS, AV, UPS & DG) will be audited by authorized technical engineers from NSEIT on mutually agreed dates for which venue facility to be provided free of cost.
6. NSEIT shall provide the Initial audit findings report to the test venue SPOC with the details on gaps and deviations observed in the infrastructure not meeting the requirements.
7. That the Venue provider POC shall undertake to resolve the discrepancies notified in the audit in less than 2 working days from the date of receipt of report.
8. That all the changes done and resolutions provided to meet the technical requirements of the infrastructure signing after the initial audit shall remain unaltered at the test venue or maintained under different user profile settings for NSEIT exams purpose.
9. In case of qualified and audited venue being booked by raising the PO for any particular exam, the PO will be revoked, if there are open audit findings/discrepancies found about venue infrastructure necessary for smooth conduct of online exam and not resolved within mutually discussed time/2 working days.
10. That the personnel assigned by the test venue SPOC for the pre-exam day activities & exam day activities need to report as per the timings discussed in advance by NSEIT SPOC and/or mentioned in the schedule / during training for the exams.

That the test venue SPOC shall ensure that the PCs allotted for the exam has the NSEIT SBT (Secured Browser Tool) installed and the IE browser settings done as per the specifications shared prior to the pre-exam day to enable conduct of venue readiness test on the pre-exam day. Internet access must be disabled on all exam PCs except our Server. Antivirus must be installed and updated on all exam PCs. Unauthorized program such as remote login tools / software must NOT be available and NOT installed on any exam PCs. 12. That the personnel assigned by the test venue will undergo a class-room and on-job training on the pre-exam day for the various roles they handle, the schedule for the training shall be shared to the test venue SPOC.

13. That the test venue SPOC shall ensure the personnel assigned shall report on time for the training as per the training schedule. The authorized venue head shall also assign one back-up personnel for every two person for the training to manage contingency.
14. That the test venue SPOC shall ensure the entire test venue infrastructure provided for the exams are in proper working condition. NSEIT shall not be liable to pay any charges to venue infrastructure service provider in the event of exam being cancelled due to infrastructure failure or issues related to shortage or quality of manpower provided by the venue.


